RESULTS

3,030 PROGRAM GRADUATES

Of these graduates: 85% have undetectable viral load, 74% disclose HIV status to their community or someone close to them, and 96% participate in a savings group.

9,054 CHILDREN WITH FAMILIES

Children are spared from becoming orphans because a parent was served by CARE for AIDS.
